

Electricity Supply in Africa – is the situation improving? – Neil Pinto

Neil graduated in 1976 from Cambridge with a degree in Engineering. He subsequently spent almost all his professional life consulting on issues associated with the development of the electricity sector worldwide, particularly in developing countries. He was resident in South Africa for some time, and in 1996 together with four colleagues set up a small consultancy company. Prior to the sale of the company in 2014, the company had worked in nearly 100 countries, providing advice on pricing, regulation, restructuring and planning. Clients included governments, regulators, utilities, private investors, and lending agencies such as the World Bank.

After retirement in 2016, Neil became a Trustee, then Chair, of [Renewable World](#) – a small UK based charity working on the supply of clean, affordable energy to those most economically disadvantaged in Africa and Asia
